

# PRESENT PERFECT

## FORMULAS

+	<b>S + have/has + past participle</b> I have tried sushi.
-	<b>S + have not (haven't)/has not (hasn't) + past participle</b> I have not tried sushi.
?	<b>Have/Has + subject + past participle?</b> Have you tried sushi?

## EXAMPLES

PRESENT PERFECT SIMPLE TENSE (Presente Perfecto Simple)		
MODO AFIRMATIVO	MODO INTERROGATIVO	MODO NEGATIVO
<b>I have played</b> Yo he jugado	<b>Have I played?</b> ¿He Jugado?	<b>I haven't played</b> Yo no he jugado
<b>You have played</b> Tú has Jugado	<b>Have you have played?</b> ¿Has Jugado?	<b>You haven't played</b> Tú no has Jugado
<b>He has played</b> Él ha jugado	<b>Has he played?</b> ¿Ha Jugado?	<b>He hasn't played</b> Él no ha jugado
<b>She has played</b> Ella ha jugado	<b>Has she played?</b> ¿Ha Jugado?	<b>She hasn't played</b> Ella no ha jugado
<b>It has played</b> Él/Ella ha jugado	<b>Has it played?</b> ¿Ha Jugado?	<b>It hasn't played</b> Él/Ella no ha jugado
<b>We have played</b> Nosotros hemos Jugado	<b>Have we played?</b> ¿Hemos Jugado?	<b>We haven't played</b> Nosotros no hemos Jugado
<b>You have played</b> Vosotros habéis Jugado	<b>Have you played?</b> ¿Habéis Jugado?	<b>You haven't played</b> Vosotros no habéis Jugado
<b>They have played</b> Ellos han jugado	<b>Have they played?</b> ¿Han Jugado?	<b>They haven't played</b> Ellos han jugado

## USES

Usage	Example
To express things you have done in your life	She has never studied Japanese.
To express number of times you have done something	How many times have you tried to call her?
To describe recently completed actions which are important now	I have some bad news. I've lost my job.
To express situations that started in the past and are still true	I've known James for 4 or 5 years.
To describe unfinished actions or situations	I've read half of the book.
To express present result	John has missed the bus, so he'll be late.
